

[Place-names: Fishing Banks]

Reference No. 270: 'Ceann Eilean a Ghò' - There was a reef in Calbost bay where liathag was to be caught.

Reference No. 271: 'An Gob Glas' - On the south side of the bay where haddock could be caught.

Reference No. 272: 'Og Gob Creag an Toill' - Where there was a reef where liathag could be caught.

Reference No. 273: 'Beul an Teb' - In the centre of Calbost bay, halfway between stack an Fhir Mhaoil and Rudha na Creag Moiré point, is a good place for haddock.

Reference No. 274: 'Bodha Rudha na Creag Mor' - A reef off the point of Rudha Na Creag Mor. Marks to the northwest are Torr Na Buachaillean at Marvig in line with Rudha Na Creag Mor, and to the south the dwelling house on croft 11 Calbost is just visible.

Reference No. 275: 'Bodha Stack an Fhir Mhaol' - This reef is a few hundred yards offshore at the point of the stack.

Reference No. 276: 'Bodha Chorrain' - This reef is a little offshore at the point of the Corran.
